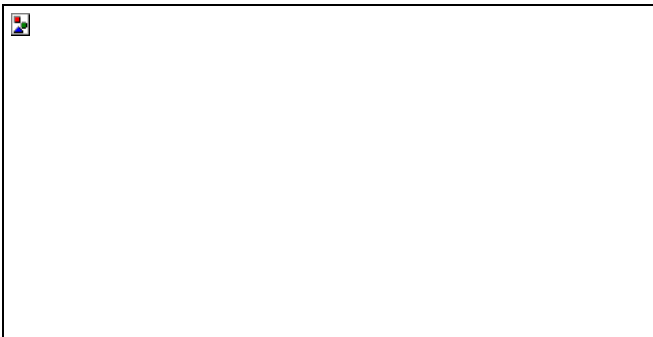
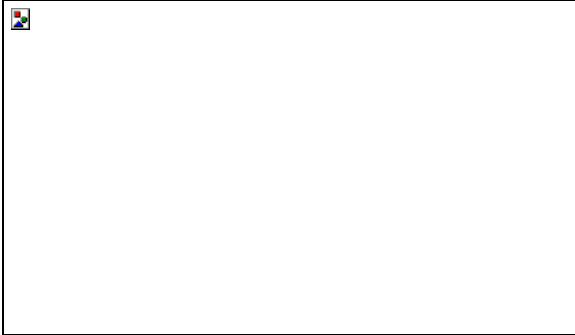



BEGINNING QUILTING A 4 session class for the very beginner. Learn rotary cutting, 1/4" piecing techniques and how to straight line quilt. The pattern is alternating 4-patch. The fee for this class is low as we know you will have to buy supplies. Sept. 26, Oct. 10, 24 & Nov. 14 from 6 - 8 pm or Nov. 14, 28, Dec. 5 & 12 from 6 to 8 pm Fee: \$15 You will need to bring a working sewing machine.	
MACHINE APPLIQUE Learn how to applique with your machine. You will need a machine capable of doing a zig zag stitch. Cute heart blocks will be made. This is a technique not a project class. December 4 from 10 am to 12:30 Fee: \$15 (includes fabric kit)	
MACHINE QUILTING For the beginning quilter. Learn the basics of straight line and freemotion quilting. A working sewing machine with a darning foot or freemotion foot is required. October 4 from 6:30 to 9 pm or November 6 from 6:30 to 9 pm. Fee: \$22 (includes fabric kit)	
CRAZY 9-PATCH or stack, slice and sew A freeing way to make an untraditional 9-patch block that is easy, quick and fun. For the beginner to the advanced. You will learn the technique and finish ½ or more of a quilt top in this 3 hour class. Oct. 13 from 1 to 4 pm Fee: \$15	
DRUNKARD'S PATH Make the large (7 inch) version of this classic pattern. A 2 session class. You will learn how to piece the blocks the first class and start setting them together the second class. A working sewing machine is required. This is NOT a beginner's class. November 2 & 16 from 10 am to 12:30 Fee: \$25	
HOLDING ONTO MEMORIES Pictures and autograph squares on fabric preserve your memories. November 3 from 10 to 12:30 Fee: \$18 (includes transferring photo to fabric)	
PFUFF MACHINE MEMORY CLASS Have a Pfaff sewing machine but need a review on how to use the memories? Then this is the class for you. Oct. 12 from 10 to noon Fee: \$10	
USING YOUR EMBROIDERY UNIT Are you intimidated by the embroidery unit for your sewing machine? Take this class and conquer your fears. Oct. 5 from 2 to 4 pm or Oct. 23 from 6 to 8pm Fee: \$15 (we will supply some fabric and stabilizers)	
EMBROIDERY CLUB We will meet for a show and share of embroidery ideas. Open to anyone doing hoop embroidery with their sewing machines. How to hoop caps will be discussed at the first meeting. Oct. 15 (Monday) from 7 to 8 pm and Nov. 12 from 7 to 8 pm.





TWISTED TAILS – A MYSTERY QUILT IN FIVE CHAPTERS. CREATED BY PEG BENNETT, WWW.QUILTZINE.COM

Mystery Quilt Chapter Three:

We will be making two different blocks in this chapter, one Snail's Trail and several Four X blocks.

To begin the Four X block, gather together: All triangles cut from the 4 1/4" square. You will have a couple left over... don't toss them, they will be used in Chapter Four. You will make 28 of these blocks. Check often to be sure these blocks measure 3 1/2".

<p>Sew two triangles together, keeping your color placement the same.</p>	 <p>4xa</p>	
<p>Sew two triangles together, keeping your color placement the same.</p>	 <p>4xb</p>	
<p>Sew two triangles from Figure 1 and 2 together, keeping your color placement the same.</p>	 <p>4xc</p>	
<p>Result:</p>  <p>4xc...</p>		







Next section- Snail's Trail

To begin the Snail's Trail block, gather together:

- * one each 2" triangle of M1, M2, D1, D2
- * one each 2 3/8" triangle of M1, M2, D1, D2
- * one each 3" triangle of M1, M2, D1, D2
- * one each 3 7/8" triangle of M1, M2, D1, D2
- * one each 1 1/4" square of M1, M2, D1, D2.

Very Important!

Refer to completed color picture of the Snails Trail block for color placement!

Sew the four 1 1/4" squares together	 A small square diagram labeled 'tt3a'.	
Add 2" triangles. Carefully trim this square to 2 5/8"	 A square diagram labeled 'tt3b' with two triangles attached to its top edge.	
Add 2 3/8" triangles. Carefully trim this square to 3 1/2"	 A square diagram labeled 'tt3c' with two triangles attached to its top edge.	
Add 3" triangles. Carefully trim this square to 4 3/4"	 A square diagram labeled 'tt3d' with three triangles attached to its top edge.	
Add 3 7/8" triangles. Carefully trim this square to 6 1/2"	 A square diagram labeled 'tt3e' with three triangles attached to its top edge.
