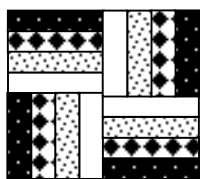
Message from the President

October's Block of the Month



Rail Fence: (unfinished 12½"): 4 shades of any one color, 2" strips, sew strips together lightest in order to the darkest, press the seams from lighter to darker (sewn strips should measure 6 ½" raw edge to raw edge), cut to 6 ½" square (need 4 squares per block), sew four blocks together as

shown.
